### Psychology Databases—Something for Everyone

Want to know a secret? Our online psychology databases, *PsycInfo*, *PsycArticles*, and *PsycBooks*, cover a lot more than just people on couches or rats in a maze. In fact, these databases can be invaluable to students and faculty in almost every subject area if you're interested in the psychology behind a behavior.

Start with *PsycInfo*, the largest of the three databases. Produced by the American Psychological Association (APA), it indexes over 1300 journals, as well as selected books and chapters. While *PsycInfo* is often the first choice of psychology and counseling students, it is also a great place to find subjects as diverse as the arts, business, medicine, law, advertising, and sports, to name a few. Here you can research the portrayals of mental disorders in literature, the psychological factors which affect consumer spending, and eating disorders in athletes. Want to know more about employee motivation, the effects of chronic illness on the family, or how to use psychology to select a jury?



*PsycInfo* will link you to materials found in the two smaller ones, *PsycArticles* and *PsycBooks*, and to items found in other Passports databases and Emerson Library and other libraries as well!

### If the PsycInfo record is for an *article*, you may see:



Means that you can link directly to the text of the article.



Means *PsycInfo* does not link to the text, but follow this link to check if the full-text is available in another Passports online database or at the Webster U Library.

### If the PsycInfo record is for a *book*, you may see:



Click here to see if the text is available online, linked from the *PsycBooks* database.



Click here to see if Webster or a library near you owns a copy of the book. To see if the book is checked *in* at a library, follow the *WorldCat* link to search the catalog.
