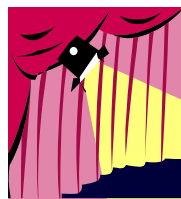
Dear Lost,

Unlike the television show *Lost*, nothing sinister or hidden is happening here. The library simply updated its web site to make it more user-oriented and less cluttered, and to meet current web design standards.

Look for, the main section, links directly to our most popular resources: online databases, the library catalog, etc. The **Information & Services** section links students and faculty at Webster's different campuses and programs to resources most appropriate for them. Under **How do I...?** you will find brief answers to FAQs on topics from doing research, to getting help, to the library's hours.

You can easily keep current with library news and web site developments with our **What's New** information found under the library photograph. In this same section click on [New library home page guide](#) for a graphical look at the old page with links to where the info resides on the new version. We hope this page will help you feel less *Lost* and more like *Friends*.

Spotlight on *ENCYCLOPAEDIA BRITANNICA*

Have you used the online *Encyclopaedia Britannica*? It's more than just an encyclopedia! It's packed with extras, including:

◆ **World Atlas** for maps displaying information such as vegetation of Asia, peoples of North America, and land use of South America.

◆ **Timelines** trace the major milestones in art, music, technology, etc. According to the "Daily Life" line, the Chinese first made tofu in 200 BC.

◆ **World Data** has statistics, rankings, & comparison tables. E.g. Afghanistan has 18,000,000 sheep; 12 televisions per 1000 persons; and is 99% Muslim compared to Zimbabwe's 530,000 sheep; 180 TVs; and 0.9% Muslims.

◆ Other items: **Notable Quotations**, **This Day in History**, **Biography of the Day**, **Year in Review** since 1993, and a built-in dictionary and a thesaurus.

Of course, you also get access to the heart of the encyclopedia, its quality articles. Here you'll find photographs, charts, maps, artwork, etc.; links to related entries and web sites and access to selected full-text journal and magazine articles.
