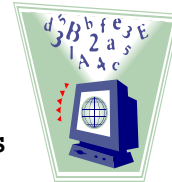

Business by the Numbers on Passports

(Hopefully) You've used Passports databases to find articles. Did you know that other business data is available online? For example, **Mergent Online** includes 20 years of annual & quarterly financial statements for thousands of U.S. and international public companies. It even includes pre-calculated company ratios.



If you want to compare a company's ratios to the industry average, check out **D&B Key Business Ratios**. For in-depth industry info., **S&P NetAdvantage** can help you to find the current operating conditions, competitors, and future trends for 50 industries. Need investment information, or a great source for clues about a company's strategy? Check out **Investext Plus** reports, which are written by investment bank and brokerage house experts. Looking for a snapshot of a company's stock performance? **ValueLine** is an industry standard. RefWorks: Simplify Your Bibliography

Often the bibliography or reference list at the end of a paper is seen as an afterthought, a hassle of formatting each citation to fit a style such as APA, MLA, AMA, etc. To help, Emerson Library recently subscribed to an online product called **RefWorks**. In library jargon, **RefWorks** is a bibliographic citation manager. Simply put, you create your own personal database of your research citations and the **RefWorks**' server stores them for you (for years) and allows you to access and manipulate them via the Internet.

To access **RefWorks**, from the main Passports page, click on [Articles / Databases](#). The first time you use **RefWorks** you will need to create a user name and password to access your personal account. Then, we recommend that you checkout the excellent online tutorial.

To build your database, you may:

- ☞ import article citations from a database, or book info from a library catalog
- ☞ import the reference list of a previous paper
- ☞ type citations in from scratch

When you're ready to create a reference list, **RefWorks** formats the bibliography for you using any of several hundred different citation styles. (BTW, **RefWorks** isn't perfect so check your bibliography for accuracy.)
